Instructions for Commodore 64/128, Apple IIGS and Macintosh

Commodore 64/128

Note: You might want to use any commercially available copying program to make a back-up copy of the disk.

- 1 Boot up *Jack Nicklaus' Greatest 18 Holes of Major Championship Golf* as you would normally, then when prompted to insert a course disk, replace the disk in the drive with the *U.S. Open* course disk. Put it in either label side up or down, depending on which course you want to play:
 - To play either Baltusrol or Oakmont, put the disk in label side up, and when prompted, press the number beside the course you want to play, and that course will load automatically.
 - To play Pebble Beach®, put the disk in label side down and press the **fire button**. The course will load automatically.
- 2 After you choose one of these courses, an overhead view of one of the holes appears on screen. To pass this screen, type the number of the illustration on the **U.S. Open Course Sheet** that is identical to the hole on your screen. Now you're ready to set up a match.

Apple IIGS or Macintosh

- 1** Use the standard PRODOS (IIGS), or Desktop (Mac) to make a back up copy of the *U.S. Open* courses before you use it (check your computer manual if you need more info on making a backup disk). Label your backup disk *U.S. Open* and put your original away for safekeeping.
- 2** Boot up *Jack Nicklaus' Greatest 18 Holes of Major Championship Golf* as you would normally, then when prompted to insert a course disk, replace the disk in the drive with the *U.S. Open* courses disk. You can now choose to play any of the three courses: Pebble Beach, Oakmont or Baltusrol.
- 3** After you choose one of these courses, an overhead view of one of the holes appears on screen. To pass this screen, type the number of the illustration on the *U.S. Open Course Sheet* that is identical to the hole on your screen. Now you're ready to set up a match.
